## EMS-ENI system is ready to use

We would like to inform you that the **Programme Electronic Monitoring System (EMS-ENI)** is fully functional and ready to use for register and submission of your projects.

In order to use the EMS-ENI system, we recommend you the following working method:

1. Create an EMS-ENI account:

- Access the link: <https://ems-ro-ua.mdrap.ro>
- Click on the “Register” command
- Fill in the Registration Form.  
*Upload the*

*Certification Letter (Annex O), with all the required information. Please take note that without the correct form of the Certification Letter, the account will not be activated.*

2. Download and fill in the Application Form:

The Application Form is part of the application package as **pdf.file** and can be downloaded from the Programme website at <http://www.ro-ua.ro-ua-md.net/en>.

Please download and save the *Application forms* locally (on your own computer), fill it in, and upload the final version into the Programme Electronic Monitoring System EMS-ENI.

3. Upload the Application Form and the supporting documents:

- Identify the appropriate *Call for proposals* under which you want to submit your project(s) – 1<sup>st</sup> Call for project proposals (HARD projects) or 2<sup>nd</sup> Call for project proposals (SOFT projects)
- Upload the Application Form and the supporting documents.  
Please note that the list of supporting documents may be found in **Section 2.6.6 of the Guidelines for Hard projects** and **Section 2.6.5 of the Guidelines for Soft projects**.
