This project responds with a modern, inclusive approach: equipping schools with smart technology, upgrading outdoor learning and sports facilities, improving accessibility, and fostering crossborder cooperation through joint educational and sports events —creating engaging, inclusive, and future-ready learning environments for all students.

Who benefits from the project?

- 4488 students use the new or modernised education facilities annually
- 10 schools and high schools in the target region

Project Outcomes

- 7 Educational institutions rehabilitated and endowed in Kalush City:
 - reconstruction of 2 grounds (volleyball and basketball) in Kalush Lyceum No. 1
 - reconstruction of the tennis field in Kalush Lyceum No. 2
 - overhaul of the stadium in Kalush Lyceum named after Dmytro Bakhmatiuk
 - overhaul of the gym and reconstruction of the schoolyard in Kalush Lyceum No. 5
 - reconstruction of the sports ground in Kalush Lyceum No. 6
 - o overhaul of the gym in Holyn Lyceum
 - overhaul of the gym and reconstruction of the mini-football field in Kopankivska Gymnasium
- 3 Educational institutions rehabilitated and endowed in Seini City (multifunctional sport field, fence with educative elements, IT equipment, open-air amphitheatre, outdoor sport equipment, learning/reading/leisure area, bike-sharing spot, and others)
- 2 study visits with 20 teachers
- 4 sports tournaments with 160 participants
- 2 organisations cooperating across borders
